Oulton Broad Parish Survey Summer 2018 - Survey Results



Thank you to all those who responded to our survey during last summer – your answers and comments have helped us form our priorities and plan for 2019, and beyond. Here is a very brief summary of the results and some of our actions from this.

1. Do you like the park in its current layout?



Suggestions included:

- Sort out the pool
- Improve the toilets
- Fix play equipment
- More litter bins &
- picnic benchesClean the landspring

2. Major projects - extra funding via a loan - in principle, would you be



happy with this?

Suggestions included:

- Public consultation before-hand
- Spend money on the pool
- Free quay CCTV
- Various renovations

Answer: We don't have any loans, and won't get a loan when we don't have to, but we appreciate the answers here to help us plan for the longer term goals.

3. What to do with the old flat above the Museum?

Suggestions included:

- Give to the Museum Residential let
- Park keeper accommodation
- Holiday let Community use suggestions

Answer: We plan to give half of the space to the Museum, so they can expand. The rest of the space will renovated to create a community room available for hire. This is a big project which is now being worked on.

4. Making better use of the Park Pavilion.

Suggestions included:

- Exercise classes Youth clubs
- All types of Community/Social groups, Children's parties and more

Answer: Work has begun on the required improvements to the building, improving its condition, making it warmer so we can offer it for more community use. Phase 2 should complete this winter.

5. Should we develop a picnic area with brick barbeque stations?



Many suggestions received here including more music concerts, craft fairs, food & drink fairs, open air cinema and many others



Vandalism



Unfortunately we've seen more vandalism and antisocial behaviour in Nicholas Everitt Park this year, with the shelter in the sunken garden burnt down, damage to property and drink and drug taking.

We have been working with the Police with more patrols taking place, and also looking to employ the service of liaison officers who could regularly visit and engage with those causing problems.

With support from the College and local businesses, we are getting the shelter rebuilt. We remind everyone that if you see or hear problems, particularly those after dark, please report every incident to the Police on 101 or 999. The Police work on the information they receive from these reports, and respond based on the numbers of reports they get, so please do report every incident as it helps us get the extra Police presence.
