## A message from Councillor Sandra Keller Chair of Oulton Broad Parish Council

In these unfortunate times since our last issue we have all had to endure another lock-down, and we hope that you all have survived safely. COVID19 continues to impact our daily lives and like everyone, we as a Parish Council have had to continue to adapt to the new challenges brought about with this pandemic. Our plans for the coming year have had to

be adjusted to fit with new conditions and budgets, but we hope you will see that we are continuing to strive to make improvements to our wonderful Parish. However, a big problem we have experienced already this year is an incredibly high level of litter being left in the park. We've seen a huge increase in the number of people using the park, which has put a lot of stress on the facilities that would not usually deal with that many park users at the same time. Additional litter bins were added but we were so saddened to still find litter left on the ground. Please remember to use the bins which are all around the park, if one bin is full (and there are some 'hot-spots' where bins get most use – we've added extra wheelie-bins here) please use another bin – you won't have to go far before you find one. If not, please take your litter home. In the words of Radio Suffolk; "don't be a tosser", it only spoils the park for others.

Hopefully later in the year we will be able to proceed with the events that we have provisionally booked.

We do hope that you are supporting our local businesses who advertise with us in these Parish Press issues, they help to keep our cost down in producing the newsletter.

You will see we have two very important surveys which are open for your response. I encourage you to complete these as they help to form plans and secure funding for important future projects.

## Oulton Broad A Statement from Suffolk Police



**Suffolk Police are working in partnership with East Suffolk Council, Oulton Broad Parish Council and the Nicholas Everitt Park Trust in Oulton Broad to prevent anti-social behaviour in the park this Summer.**

Given the year of lockdowns and restrictions, people will doubtless be keen to go outside and enjoy the beautiful surroundings of the park. However, following a range of incidents last year, the teams are working together to address potential hotspot areas and plan ahead for the warmer weather.

**PC Claire Bodmer from Suffolk Police said:**

"We are keen to look at ways we can help to maintain the safety of those enjoying the park and prevent any anti-social behaviour. Police will take any necessary steps to deter ASB and enforce the law where needed".

The park is managed by the Nicholas Everitt Park Trust, supported by Oulton Broad Parish Council. A member of the Park Trust said "We have a unique and wonderful park here in Oulton Broad, it's beautiful grounds and facilities make for a great place to relax and spend time with friends and family. We are pleased to be working together with the Police and councils to ensure it remains an area everyone can enjoy"

East Suffolk Council will assist with the implementation of certain measures and Rachel Tucker from ESC said "Nicholas Everitt Park is a fantastic place to be and should not be spoiled by an inconsiderate minority. We want to make sure it remains safe and enjoyed by all throughout the Summer"

## North Oulton Broad An Update From Bonds Meadow



Throughout the pandemic Bonds Meadow has continued to be a valued and special place for walks and meditation, offering calming, restorative mental support and well-being to residents of Oulton Broad.

Due to the heavy rainfall of last winter, wellies became the footwear of choice when negotiating the abnormally muddy and puddled footpaths, adding an extra bit of adventure to an afternoon's stroll. However, it was a day in early February when the excited cries of children could be heard throughout the meadow a brief snowfall brought play and sledging into what little had laid that morning.

This year we anxiously anticipate an increase in flora and fauna following the partially scraped grassland being re-seeded with wildflower mix and some restoration of boundary dyke, all in an attempt to retain the wetland margin and sustain bio-diversity to Bonds Meadow as a whole.

Those venturing out for walks through the woods will have seen the appearance of purple comfrey and winter heliotrope, clumps of white snowdrops and yellow carpets of daffodils heralding the return of nature's green tapestry and hope for a better year.

## Smiths Walk Play Area Refurb



Our small play area at Smiths Walk, off Beccles Road in the south of the Parish (located behind the Tesco Express petrol station) was a very sad little site when its ownership was transferred from Waveney District Council to us in 2017.

During the second half of 2020 we undertook the clearing of a huge line of overgrown conifer trees that had previously been left to grow to an unacceptable size. The removal of these has allowed the site to be opened up for improved use. New fencing has been installed as necessary, and we have planted new hedgerow in place of the old conifers that will provide a more diverse habitat for wildlife. The new hedging is planted with hawthorn, blackthorn, field maple and dogwood.

We are now looking to replace the old play equipment with new, higher quality, play frame and swings. This project will progress over the course of this summer and we will keep you updated. You will find currently the existing swings at this site are fenced off as the surfacing is badly damaged. This will all be replaced as part of this refurbishment.

# Park Code



This is your Park – help us to keep it a friendly and safe place to enjoy. Follow the Park Code and enjoy your visit to Nicholas Everitt Park.

- We prefer you not to drink Alcohol in the open areas of the park (stay within the licensed premises)
- If you are meeting friends – keep your group small and respect others
- Respect Social Distancing rules if these are currently in place
- Please do not play loud music which could disturb others
- Use the litter bins or take your litter home
- Clear up after your dogs
- We do not allow e-scooters in the park for safety reasons
- If you see others using the park irresponsibly, let us know. **Call 101. In an emergency always call 999.**
- Our security staff are there to help you – please respect them. If you are breaking the code, they may ask you to leave park
- For your protection CCTV operates throughout the park and will be used to identify unacceptable behaviour. Our security staff also wear body worn recording devices.

**It is currently against the law to ride an e-scooter on a public road or pavement.**



The only place an e-scooter can be used is on private land, with the landowners permission. E-scooters are classified as Personal Light Electric Vehicles (PLEVs), so they are treated as motor vehicles and subject to the same legal requirements.

## Oulton Broad Parish Council Survey: Renovation of the 'Old Flat' in Broad House

Above the Lowestoft Museum in Broad House is an empty space, known by many as the 'old flat'. From our survey undertaken in Summer 2018 we took on board the suggestions and are progressing the project to convert this area (that has been unused for decades) into a new space allowing for the Lowestoft Museum to expand, a new office space for the parish council and NEP charity trust, and also a community meeting room which will be available for hire (providing an income to the charity).

Planning permission for the project is already granted and essential works to make the space safe have been done. We require funding to complete the works and propose obtaining a special low interest loan, available to government bodies, from the Public Works Loan Board.

It was resolved to seek the approval of the Secretary of State for Housing, Communities and Local Government to apply for a PWLB loan of £95,000 over the borrowing term of 10 years for the Expansion of the Lowestoft Museum into the Broad House Flat and also creating a new Community Meeting Room and Parish Council Office space.

The annual loan repayments will come to around £10,610. It is also intended to increase the council tax precept for the purpose of the loan repayments by 4.96% which is equivalent of an additional £4.09 a year on a Band D property. This will be subject to a precept increase consultation.
